Digging?

o If you plan to do any digging, the Utility Notification Center has a new number to call: 811. Planning ahead and taking the simple step to have your phone lines marked can help insure uninterrupted telephone service.

Do Not Call

O It is your right to register with the national "Do Not Call" database. Customers may register their residential telephone number, including wireless numbers, on the national Do-Not-Call Registry at no cost, either by telephone or via the Internet. To register on the Internet go to www.donotcall.gov or by telephone, call 1-888-382-1222 or TTY, call 1-866-290-4236. You must call from the telephone number you wish to register. Do-Not-Call Registry will be effective three months following your registration. Your number will remain in the registry for five years, at which time you may re-enter your number on the list.

Colorado Public Utilities Commission

o In compliance with the Colorado Public Utilities Commission rules, this is to advise you that calling party telephone numbers, including non-listed or unpublished numbers, may be revealed to called parties that subscribe to Caller ID, ISDN and toll free 1-800/888/900 numbers. These called parties are restricted from reusing or selling the calling parties telephone numbers. For more information about calling number delivery, please call 379-3839.
